### Changes to step-free access at Hounslow East

THERE will be no step-free access to the westbound Piccadilly line at Hounslow East Tube station from Monday until Saturday March 29 while lift maintenance work takes place.

For step-free access to westbound trains, manual wheelchair users can take buses 81, 203, 222, H32 or H98 from bus stop C on London Road and use the stair lift at Hounslow West.

Alternatively, for Heathrow, take local bus 111 from stop EE opposite the station to Heathrow Central bus station.

Customers who usually exit westbound trains at Hounslow East can stay on the train to Hounslow West, and return on eastbound services.

There are no planned works on the Bakerloo, District, Circle, Hammersmith & City, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, or London Tramlink. However, the following lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works:

#### Central line

#### Part closure

**All weekend:** No service between North Acton and West Ruislip owing to drainage improvement at Hanger Lane and South Ruislip. Replacement bus services will run:

Service B: North Acton – Northolt – South Ruislip – Ruislip Gardens – West Ruislip

Service C: North Acton – Park Royal (for the Piccadilly line) – Hanger Lane – Perivale – Greenford – Northolt

#### Jubilee line

#### Part closure

**Sunday:** No service between Waterloo and Finchley Road until 11am owing to essential tunnelling work. Use alternative Tube and/or bus services.

#### Northern line

#### Part closure

**All weekend:** No service between Kennington and Morden while new signalling is tested. Replacement bus services will run:

Service H: Clapham Common – Clapham South – Balham (for National Rail services to/from Victoria) – Tooting Bec – Tooting Broadway – Colliers Wood – South Wimbledon – Morden

Service J: Elephant & Castle – Kennington – Oval – Stockwell – Clapham North – Clapham Common – Clapham South – Balham (southbound buses will run to Tooting Bec)

Service X: Wimbledon (for the District line, National Rail services and London Tramlink) – South Wimbledon – Morden

Be aware that owing to the work, some 'next train' platform indicators may give the incorrect destination. All southbound trains will terminate at Kennington.

#### Docklands Light Railway

#### Part closure

**All weekend:** No service between Bank/Tower Gateway and Canning Town/Canary Wharf owing to track improvement work. Replacement buses will run:

Bank – Tower Gateway – Shadwell – Limehouse – Westferry – Canary Wharf – Blackwall – East India – Canning Town

**All weekend:** No service between Stratford and Canary Wharf owing to Crossrail work. Replacement buses will run:

Stratford – Pudding Mill Lane – Bow Church – Devons Road – Langdon Park – All Saints – Blackwall – Canary Wharf

#### London Overground

#### Part closure

**Sunday:** No service between Highbury & Islington and Clapham Junction/New Cross Gate until 8am owing to track work. Tickets will be accepted on local buses.

**Sunday:** No service between New Cross Gate and Crystal Palace/West Croydon owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will run.

### Improvements at Gunnersbury

THE refurbishment of Gunnersbury Tube station is now complete.

Benefits include:

- A larger, more spacious ticket hall and a wider gateline, to cut congestion at busy times
- The addition of two wide-aisle gates to improve accessibility
- New lighting, PA systems and CCTV cameras to improve safety and security

Every effort was made to minimise disruption to customers during the improvement works, as London Underground's project manager Terry Wheaton explains: 'Works in public areas were carried out during off-peak hours, daytimes and in 3.5 hour shifts and throughout the night.'

'Although the ticket office was closed for a 12-week period for the duration of the works, the station remained fully operational.'

### Greenford station update

A NEW escalator went into service last week at Greenford Tube station as part of work to improve accessibility.

Other benefits to follow will include:

- A new wider staircase, with tactile paving designed to help visually impaired customers
- Additional CCTV to enhance safety and security
- A new incline lift, the first of its kind on the Tube network, that will provide step-free access to Tube and rail services

David Waboso CBE, London Underground's director of capital programmes, said: 'As part of our commitment to make the Tube more accessible, work is on schedule to make Greenford Tube station step-free by next year. Other improvement work at the station will be completed in 2016.'

'The incline lift will have a higher capacity because it has entry and exit doors at opposite sides of the lift cabin. This will make it easier for wheelchair users and passengers with buggies because they will not have to turn round when they leave, as they would in a conventional lift with one set of access doors.'
