2212        The Minutes of the Board Meeting held on the 10<sup>th</sup> October 1917

2214        The Resident Director reported  
Additional War Bonus to Administrative Staff  
That it has been decided to grant an additional War Bonus to all  
Members of the Administrative Staff to meet the increased cost of

The new bonus to be payable as from 1<sup>st</sup> October 1917. That copy of circular dated 1<sup>st</sup> November setting out the matter in detail was submitted.

Award of Committee on Production in respect of application for increased War Bonus to L.G.O. Employees

That the Committee on Production had issued their findings in respect of the application for an increased War Bonus made to the London General Omnibus Company by the London and Provincial Union of Licensed Vehicle Workers on behalf of all Drivers and Conductors (male and female) and the inside Adult Staff.

A copy of the findings dated 25<sup>th</sup> October 1917 was submitted.

The Clause in the Award dealing with the case of Engineering labourers attached to or working with skilled craftsmen was found to be incapable of proper construction and had therefore been referred back to the Committee for explanation.

London General Omnibus Company and Home Office

That there was nothing further to state in this matter, but arrangements were in hand for an early interview with Sir Edward Troup, the permanent Secretary to the Home Office.

2217

London United Tramways Ltd

Mr W. M. Acworth the Chairman of the London United Tramways reported the result of the negotiations between the Company's Board of Directors and the Committee of Debenture Holders.

Arrangements were in hand with a view to promoting a Bill in Parliament and the Committee of Debenture Holders had promised to apply to the Court for permission for the Receiver to advance the costs in connection with the Bill.

The preparation of the Bill was in hand and a clause would be inserted respecting increased fares extension of tenure, and readjustment of the purchase clause.

Financial Statements

That Cash Statement to date of the finances of the Company was submitted. After discussion

It was resolved that the drawing of cheques since the date of the last Board Meeting as per details shown on the Cash Statement be and the same is hereby approved and confirmed.

A Statement of the Capital position of the Company was also submitted and discussed.

2219 Fixed Deposit with Messrs Speyer Brothers

Referring to the Minutes of the Board Meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> October 1917.

That the Board of the London General Omnibus Company Limited had approved the recommendation of the Finance Committee and accepted the offer of Messrs Speyer Brothers to repay £50,000 out of the total of £100,000 then with them on fixed deposit and to continue the balance for six months from 15<sup>th</sup> October at 5½% per annum and that the transaction had been duly carried through.

2220 Associated Equipment Company's holding in 3½% War Loan

Referring to the Minutes of the Board Meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> October 1917.

That the question of the sale of the £100,000 3½% War Loan Stock 1925/1928 belonging to the Associated Equipment Company had been further considered by Mr Acworth and Mr Vernet, who recommended that the Stock should be sold forthwith.

This had been done and the price obtained was 85 less 1/16<sup>th</sup> Commission and Stamps.

2221 Registration Work

It was resolved that the Sealing of Ordinary Share Certificates for 5372 Shares in respect of transfers etc be and the same is hereby approved and confirmed.

It was further resolved that the sealing of 'A' Ordinary 1/- Share Certificates for 13,114 Shares in respect of transfers etc be and the same is hereby approved and confirmed.

2222 Dates and Times of Meetings for 1918

That Chart was submitted giving the dates and times of Boards and other Meetings for the year 1918.

It was resolved that the proposed dates and times be provisionally approved.

2223

Lost Coupons of 4½% Bonds

That the London and Provincial Bank Limited Finchley branch had intimated that one of their Clients Miss S. M. Burton had lost coupons No 17 off 4½% Bonds.

and that a Statutory Declaration and Letter of Indemnity had been received in respect of the same.

It was resolved that the value of the lost coupons be paid by cheque.

Retainers to Counsel

The Solicitor explained that Leading and Junior Counsel held general retainers on behalf of various Companies in the Underground Group.

It was considered the Companies should not be handicapped in briefing the most suitable Counsel and suggested that all general retainers should be withdrawn. After discussion

It was resolved to recommend to all the Companies concerned that all general retainers be withdrawn and that Mr Honeratus Lloyd, Mr Clode and Mr Szlumper be given retainers for the Parliamentary Session 1917/1918.

It was further resolved to recommend that in due course Mr Honoratus Lloyd be again given a general retainer.
