


Highbury & Islington station update

FROM Monday until mid-October, temporary entry/exit and interchange arrangements will apply during the morning and evening peaks at Highbury & Islington station. This is owing to escalator refurbishment work.

If you are entering the station on weekdays between 8am and 9.30am, or between 5pm and 6.30pm, one entrance/exit will be for the Victoria line/National Rail platforms and the other for the London Overground platforms.

To change between Overground services and the Victoria line/National Rail platforms, you must touch out at the gates, exit the station then touch in on the other gateline. Your Oyster card will not be charged twice. If you are not travelling via Zone 1, you should continue to also



use the pink route validators on the Overground platforms.

There are no planned track works on the Bakerloo, Central, Circle, Jubilee, Metropolitan, Piccadilly, Victoria or Waterloo & City lines, Docklands Light Railway or London Tramlink. However, the following stations and lines will be affected by engineering and improvement works.

Bakerloo line

Station closure

Edgware Road: Closed until late December owing to lift replacement work. Edgware Road (Circle and Hammersmith & City lines) is the nearest alternative station. Trains from here connect with Bakerloo line services at Baker Street and Paddington.

District line

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Tower Hill and East Ham owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel and track replacement in the Mile End area. Replacement buses will run:
 Service A: Tower Hill – Aldgate East – Whitechapel – Stepney Green – Mile End – Bow Road – Stratford (for the Central and Jubilee lines, Docklands Light Railway and London Overground) – Upton Park – East Ham
 Service B: Mile End – Bow Road – Bromley-by-Bow – Canning Town (for the Jubilee line and Docklands Light Railway) – Plaistow – Stratford (for the Central and Jubilee lines, Docklands Light Railway and London Overground)

Road users advised to avoid Victoria

DRIVERS are being urged to avoid the Victoria area if possible owing to delays caused by a burst Thames Water main on Buckingham Gate and Buckingham Palace Road. Some roads are closed and traffic is slow moving, with queues through Hyde Park Corner on to Park Lane. Park Lane southbound is also slow moving approaching Marble Arch. The bus services on diversion are C1, C2, C10, 16, 44, 52 and 82.

All weekend: No service between Moorgate and Barking owing to Crossrail work at Whitechapel and track replacement in the Mile End area. See the District line entry for replacement bus information.

Northern line

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Golders Green/East Finchley and Stockwell, via Bank and Charing Cross, while new signalling is tested and work continues to enlarge and rebuild Tottenham Court Road station.
 Replacement buses will run:
 Service B: East Finchley – Highgate – Archway – Tufnell Park – Kentish Town – Camden Town – King's Cross St. Pancras
 Service C: Arnos Grove (for the Piccadilly line) – North Finchley (Tally Ho Corner) – West Finchley – Finchley Central
 Service E: Finchley Road (for the Jubilee line) – Golders Green – Hampstead – Belsize Park – Chalk Farm – Camden Town – Mornington Crescent – Euston
 Service G: Elephant & Castle (for Bakerloo line trains to central London) – Kennington – Oval – Stockwell (for Victoria line trains to central London)
 To help customers during the Northern line closure, the Waterloo & City line will run for longer: on Saturday from 8am until 10pm, and on Sunday from 10am until 8pm.

London Overground

Part closure

All weekend: No service between Gospel Oak and Barking owing to Network Rail bridge replacement work. Replacement buses will call at: Hampstead Heath – Gospel Oak (bus stops in Agincourt Road/Southampton Road) – Upper Holloway – Crouch Hill – Harringay Green Lanes – South Tottenham – Blackhorse Road – Walthamstow Queen's Road – Walthamstow Central – Leyton Midland Road – Leytonstone High Road – Wanstead Park – Woodgrange Park – Barking.
Sunday: No service between Surrey Quays and Clapham Junction owing to Network Rail track work. Replacement buses will call at: Canada Water – Surrey Quays – Queens Road Peckham – Peckham Rye – Denmark Hill – Clapham High Street – Wandsworth Road – Clapham Junction.
